Circular Letter No.4770 1 September 2023

Subject:

International Maritime Prize, 2023

- The Secretary-General has the honour to invite nominations for candidates for the International Maritime Prize for 2023. The Prize is awarded each year to individuals and non-governmental organizations or bodies judged by the IMO Council to have made a significant contribution to the Organization's work and objectives. The Council may decide not to bestow an award in any year if, in its opinion, no suitable candidates have been nominated for that year. A summary of the objectives and functions of the Organization is given in annex 1 to this circular letter.
- 2 Nominations for the Prize may be made only by:
 - .1 Governments:
 - organizations, specialized agencies, programmes and funds of the United Nations system;
 - .3 intergovernmental organizations in cooperation with IMO; and
 - .4 non-governmental organizations in consultative status with IMO.
- 3 Governments, intergovernmental organizations and entities are not eligible for the Prize. Sponsoring Governments, organizations, agencies and other nominating entities may each nominate only **one** candidate for the Prize. A list of the previous recipients of the Prize is attached in annex 2 to this circular letter.
- The recipient of the Prize will be presented with a trophy at a special ceremony to coincide with an IMO meeting taking place at the Headquarters of the Organization, and will be invited to write an academic paper on a subject related to the Organization's objectives and work, for publication by IMO. For this purpose, the recipient of the award will receive a stipend of \$1,000 and, if necessary, appropriate expenses in connection with travel to attend the ceremony at IMO Headquarters.
- The Secretary-General would be most grateful if nominations of candidates to be considered for the 2023 Prize could be sent to him as soon as possible, to reach the Organization by no later than 31 March 2024. Nominations should indicate clearly the name and designation of the Government or other authority submitting the nomination and



bear an appropriate mark of authentication. A nomination form is attached in annex 3. Governments and organizations may, however, submit nominations in other forms, provided that adequate information is given to enable the Council to assess the merits of the candidates concerned.

ANNEX 1

OBJECTIVES AND FUNCTIONS OF THE ORGANIZATION

The major objectives of the Organization are:

- .1 to provide machinery for cooperation among Governments in the field of governmental regulation and practices relating to technical matters of all kinds affecting shipping engaged in international trade; to encourage and facilitate the general adoption of the highest practicable standards in matters concerning maritime safety, efficiency of navigation and prevention and control of marine pollution from ships; and to deal with administrative and legal matters related to the purposes of the Organization;
- .2 to provide for the consideration by the Organization of any matters concerning shipping and the effect of shipping on the marine environment that may be referred to it by any organ or specialized agency of the United Nations; and
- .3 to provide for the exchange of information among Governments on matters under consideration by the Organization.

For the achievement of its objectives, the Organization:

- .1 considers and makes recommendations upon matters within its competence that may be remitted to it by Members, the United Nations or any specialized agency of the United Nations or by any other appropriate intergovernmental organization;
- .2 provides for the drafting of conventions, agreements or other suitable instruments by convening such conferences as may be necessary and recommends the resulting instruments to Governments and to intergovernmental organizations for acceptance, implementation or enforcement as may be appropriate;
- .3 performs functions assigned to it by or under international instruments relating to maritime matters and the effect of shipping on the marine environment;
- .4 promotes measures for the effective implementation and enforcement of international standards and regulations adopted by the Organization or contained in international treaty instruments; and
- .5 facilitates, as necessary, technical cooperation within the scope of the Organization, including the provision of services and other appropriate assistance to Governments, particularly those of developing countries.
